So, with that, I'm going to introduce our speaker, Sara Potter.

Sara Potter is the Director for the Office of Performance and Quality Measurement within HRSA's office of Planning, Analysis, and evaluation.

She has expertise in policy research and analysis, strategy development, and strategic management.

18 years with the Department of Health and Human Services.

2:18

Sarah has also worked in the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation, asby, the Administration for Children and Families and the Office of inter-governmental Affairs.

2:32

Prior to joining HHS, Sarah worked for a child maltreatment, prevention and initiatives, and several non-profit organizations focused on the stabilization of families investigated by child protective services.

Therapeutic care for children with disabilities and woman's health issues.

She has earned an MS in Political Science from Suffolk University and has a BA in Religion and biblical literature.

So with that, Sarah, I'm going to turn it over to you.

two, take us away.

Sarah Potter:

3:06

Thank you. Thank you so much, Nathan. We're so grateful to you for giving us time today to share information about our program.

3:17

Can you see this next slide? Just making sure my slides are working.

Nathan Baugh:

3:22

We can. Yes.

Sarah Potter:

OK, great. I want to acknowledge the team at HRSA, who helped us put this program together, as well as these slides that share information, as well as thanking my colleagues and the federal Office of Rural Health Policy for connecting us to your group. So that we could talk about this program.

3:46

It is really been a team effort here at HRSA to get these payments out to rural health clinics and federally qualified health centers.

3:55

So, I'm thrilled today to be here to talk to you about this very long substance use disorder prevention that promotes opioid recovery and treatment for patients and communities act. Support Act payments to ask RHCS and FQHCs.

4:14

So, the official title of the program is the Data 2000 Waiver Training Payments Program, and today will familiarize you with this program, help you identify and assess your organization's eligibility to apply for payments, Help you understand the application, processes and requirements, actually very simple, and then review answers to Frequently Asked Questions.

4:41

We launched this program about a month ago, and we've received some questions along the way that we will answer during this webinar.

4:53

So, an overview of the program.

4:56

So, it was created in response to the opioid crisis. The purpose of the program is to improve health care by promoting greater access to substance use disorder treatment through payments to RHCS and FQHCs.

5:13

For healthcare providers who have a data 2000 wave or a Drug Addiction Treatment Act of 2000 wafer to furnish opioid services. Through medication assisted treatment. The total amount of funding that we've been appropriated by Congress is \$8 million, two million for RHCS and six million for FQHCs.

5:39

So, we're issuing payments drawing down on these funds until they're fully expended.

5:45

Funds are dispensed on a first come, first served basis. So we're very excited to be able to meet with you so soon after our launch so that we can help you access these funds.

6:00

So, eligibility requirements. the applicant organization is not the provider.

6:06

It is the rural health clinic or federally qualified health center. You must be certified by CMS as active and have a valid CMS certification, number, or CCN.

6:21

Applicant organizations apply on behalf of providers who meet eligibility requirements.

6:29

These can be physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, certified nurse midwives, clinical nurse specialists, certified registered nurse anesthetists, My goodness. You must have attained data 2000 waiver on or after January 1, 2019.

6:48

You must be employed by or working under contract for the RHC or FQHC. And you can be claimed only once. So, you cannot get multiple payments. So, if you work at one an RHC and another RHC can't be paid twice.

7:07

Opioid Use Disorder services are described here on the slide.

7:12

These are pretty comprehensive, including they use treatment's listed here, the payment methodology and amount.

7:25

So, our team at the Office of Planning, Analysis and Evaluation investigated what the reasonable rate per provider would be based on not just the cost of training, but the hourly, sort of, cost for the provider to attend the training.

7:49

So we anticipated an average hourly payment rate of \$130 per hour, the maximum training requirement of 24 hours.

8:00

So the payment amount rounding up to \$3000, this was used using average, 2019 hourly payment rates.

8:11

All right.

8:11

So the application, it is, we hope, very straightforward, very simple. We encourage you first to gather this information before you login to our system and submit the application.

8:29

It'll make it a lot easier for the organization.

8:34

Uh, if you enter your duns number, tax ID number, it will automatically populate your mailing address, which we hope makes it a little bit easier. You will need to enter your CCN or CMS Certification Number, as well as contact information for who in the organization.

9:00

Can be contacted for questions about the application if we do have questions.

9:07

For providers, we ask for the full provider name, the provider type, the types that we listed on an earlier slide, state medical license number and their NPI number, their national provider identifier number.

9:21

The system will automatically reject incorrect NPIs, so making sure that that information is correct.

9:30

When you sit there.

9:32

For the data 2000 waiver, we asked for the length and hours and the date of the training, the certification date, which of course must be after January 1, 2019.

9:45

The system will automatically reject anything that is earlier than that date and then the waiver number and the DEA number.

9:57

We want to make sure that you have the necessary accounts in order to apply through our electronic handbooks site.

10:06

So you must have a duns number, so registering through sam, the System for Award Management, in order to get that duns number for your entity. We have listed here, and we'll have the slides available to you, you can watch a video on how to set up an account, and sam dot gov can give you additional information.

10:30

The Electronic Handbook site is where you can apply through HRSA. You can create an account on our registration page. We'll provide these slides, so you can access that link. And there is a video on how to get started.

10:46

And then finally, you login to the electronic handbooks, what we call the ..., and submit your application. It's very simple. You can see the screenshot here, there's an Organization tab on the menu bar. You click on that.

11:02

I hope you can see it's very small, But the Data 2000 Waiver Training Payment Program will appear, You click on that and are able to submit your application.

11:15

We have a help page, first step by step guide, some videos, and some FAQs.

11:23

All right, so, FAQs.

11:26

When is the deadline to apply?

11:29

So, there is no deadline, but available funds, as we said earlier, are limited and will be paid on a first come first serve basis.

11:38

HRSA will accept applications and process payments until all available funds are exhausted. I would encourage folks to not delay in submitting an application for payment.

11:51

We have received a very aye, robust response to our launch.

11:58

Not so much for a rural health clinic, so we're hoping that this webinar will help us get the word out, to promote the program, but we would encourage you not to wait.

12:12

Eligibility question, so, we've received a few questions asking, you know, my provider receives their waiver in December of 2018.

12:21

Can you give us pass?

12:23

And unfortunately, because of our legislation, eligibility is restricted just to those providers who obtained their waiver on or after January first, 2019.

12:36

We've also received requests from providers to see if they can submit an application for payment, but only RHCS and FQHCs can submit the application.

12:50

So at in the process of developing this program, preparing it for launch, SAMHSA, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, issued new practice guidelines and waved a training requirement for prescribing medication assisted treatment.

13:11

And so, we have received a lot of questions saying that if your provider is exempt from the training repack the requirements and receives there waiver under the exemption, can they still apply for the payment?

13:25

And the answer is no.

13:27

You can only receive payment if the provider received training.

13:33

So if a provider has an exemption and their DEA, their data 2000 waver number will note that they've received an exemption, they will not be able to receive to be eligible for the payment.

Nathan Baugh:

13:47

Hey, Sarah.

Sarah Potter:

Yes, sure! So I'm happy to answer any questions about this.

Nathan Baugh:

13:53

Is, is there, I don't know if you can answer this.

13:56

Is there rumblings, or rumors about, like this guidance kind of sticking post pandemic?

14:07

And like the and they're going away or is this a pandemic related mills?

14:12

HE.

Sarah Potter:

14:15

I didn't see it tied to the pandemic.

14:19

What I've heard from multiple folks, is that they're trying to promote getting the waiver, and make it less burdensome for people to get the waiver, and try to expand the pool of physicians, and practitioner, to have the waiver.

14:39

So, I think it was really a response to the opioid crisis more than tied to covid, and that's my impression based on conversations that I've had.

Nathan Baugh:

OK, OK, So, to providers that are exempt from training requirements, is, is that like just the physicians or what is at a type of physician? That's exempt, or?

Sarah Potter:

15:04

Sure.

15:05

So, right now, you can apply through the SAMHSA site to get this exemption, to be able to treat up to 30 payments without going through the training, Providers would like to do that.

15:20

So, which is wonderful, but for the purposes of this program, HRSA will provide the payments only for those providers that have actually gone through that training.

15:35

It was sort of providing a, sort of, after the fact incentive to provide that training.

Nathan Baugh:

so, if you do, if you want to do more than 30 patients, you still need the data 2000 waiver

Sarah Potter:

15:47

yeah,

Nathan Baugh:

OK, thank you.

Sarah Potter:

15:51

Yeah, sure.

15:54

So, how does the provider obtains data 2000 waiver and SAMHSA issues those waivers they issue through the exemption, and also, for folks who still want to do the training, where her hearing from SAMHSA that there are still providers who want to do the training.

16:12

And, we have a link here on how to become a be wavered practitioner.

16:19

After you submit your application, SAMHSA will review the application within 45 days and e-mail and approve a letter.

16:27

When we tested the application with RHCS and FQHCs to see if it was simple to use, we heard quite a lot about the challenges of surveying this population and the need to expand waiver providers. So we're hoping that this will help expand that number.

16:50

And if folks would like to verify a practitioners' data number, data waver number, you can go to this website: SAMHSA dot gov slash B slash lookup form. In order to get information, you'll need their name, and some other information that you'll be able to get their date, that they achieve the waiver, for example.

17:16

So, we've received multiple application scenarios, and you want to walk through a few that might be familiar to you. You might be also experiencing this in your program. So, a person wrote to us and said, We have several wavered providers that my RHC, do we have to submit a separate

application for each provider. And the good news is you can you don't have to submit multiple applications. The application form will allow you to add providers.

17:45

I think we had one application that submitted for 40 providers so it is able to accept quite a few providers through the application.

17:58

Another question is we have a wavered provider at my RHC and have all the necessary information to apply. But another provider is just in process of obtaining a waiver. Don't have it yet.

18:10

Do we have to wait to apply until everybody has their waiver?

18:14

And the great news is you do not have to wait. You can submit multiple applications, so you could submit applications for the provider to have their waivers now.

18:22

Mandy can submit a separate application for that, other provider who's still getting their waiver once they have it.

18:30

But just again, to note, that our acceptance and processing of applications is subject to the availability of funds.

18:37

So we would encourage you not to wait for the providers who already have their waiver.

18:43

Then my application was not process because of an error. Can I resubmit an application? Absolutely, and you don't have to wait to resubmit. We understand that, you know, in many cases and and we've seen this an application, people will transpose numbers and get a rejection. It's OK, definitely resubmit, Our goal is to issue these payments.

19:10

We've received a lot of questions about the CMS certification number, and we wanted to share where you can find your CMS certification number.

19:22

So HRSA has it publicly available tool, where you can search, the link will be in the slides, and you can click on your provider number, and that displays your CCN. You can filter by your site name to find your CCN.

19:40

It should be very transparent, and other folks have asked us and ask we have a Medicare and Medicaid provider number. Can I use that number instead of the CCN? Yes, the CCN was previously known as the Medicare Medicaid Provider Number. Also known as the Oscar provider number, the Medicare Identification Number, And as mentioned, on our HRSA site, as the provider number.

And we have a link to a CMS manual for more information.

I want to show the explorer tool.

I'm hoping that this well work for folks is paddings screen sharing.

All right, I am going to close this then.

Um, I was hoping to be able to go in and show you the tool.

All right. So sample scenarios for the CCN. We've received a number of questions about this, folks who have multiple CCN for different sites in their service area.

20:53

And asking if they need to submit a separate application for each site where there is an eligible provider.

21:00

So if all of your providers have one CCN number and comment or a couple of CCN numbers and comment, you can submit, you know, that application under that single number.

21:16

If however your providers provide services through multiple CCN because the application is tied to the CCN, you would have to submit through the multiple submit multiple applications.

21:31

Unfortunately, we're hoping that maybe your providers will have one CCN number uncommented to minimize the burden of applying.

21:43

Um, alright. Next slide. Reporting requirements. So we've received a few questions about whether there are limitations or reporting requirements associated with the use of the payments.

21:58

And our legislation is silent on limitations or reporting requirements.

22:06

So there are no restrictions on how you use the funds no reporting requirements regarding the funds your organization received.

22:15

We do want to make it clear that payments are issued by hertha to the RHC or FQHC not to that provider.

22:29

So, here are the links to the, the FAQs, the video, and just the general information about the program. Folks want to connect to them directly.

22:41

And if you have questions, technical questions related to sort of the nuts and bolts of the application, you can call our helpdesk at (877) 464-4772 if you have more programmatic related questions needs, some deeper technical assistance, you can contact me and my team at Data 2000 wave or payments at HRSA dot gov.

So, you said that I think most RHCS know they're CCN at this point so it's probably water under the bridge. But I've never used that message that you suggested to find a CCN.

Alright.

23:59

And I was a little worried because it said health center sites.

24:04

And yes.

24:05

Yeah. And I just wanted to make sure that.

24:07

So that includes rural health clinics in that.

Sarah Potter:

yes, it does.

24:12

And the reason that you've never used it before, is because it's brand new, it was just launched earlier this year, OK.

Nathan Baugh:

24:21

Well, good, good to know.

24:24

Yes, there's, there's, I don't know, is that very, it looks like a website developed in 1995, but there's a website called Q core.

24:37

That CMS maintains that I've traditionally used to

24:41

identify someone's CCN.

24:44

But.

24:45

So I would love, if you can, if you are able to walk us through that process, I would actually love to see that. So if I, when you shared that, your screen it didn't didn't go.

Sarah Potter:

It said it has parsed screen sharing.

25:06

So I Maybe I'm happy to try it again. But I'm worried.

Nathan Baugh:

25:15

Maybe. Exit out of the PowerPoint, and put it, and put it up there.

Sarah Potter:

25:20

OK, Can I pause my sharing and load something up?

Nathan Baugh:

And yes, let me get back.

25:32

Well, I'm on it.

25:35

But you can, I guess you could walk me through it.

Sarah Potter:

25:38

But I can change the presenter to you.

25:45

I'll walk you through.

Nathan Baugh:

my screen already.

25:48

Oh, OK, great, So this will be a great test of whether or not I can be helpful to explain, OK. Yes, we're doing it live.

Sarah Potter:

OK, so what I'll do Sure, click on Health center Program site, it doesn't look like a link, but it is the link and then click on all health centers, and then click View Data .

26:26

Alright. Great.

26:29

You should be able to scroll up on the screen and see the Show Hide Columns button.

26:47

So let's, let's go back All right, OK. Come back.

26:56

All right. Query Data.

27:01

OK, and let's try Healthcare facilities.

27:09

I'm not sure why it's not working and then view data.

Nathan Baugh:

27:15

yeah, I kind of had a suspicion that we wouldn't be in the health center.

Sarah Potter:

27:21

It shared. there, we are Show Hide Column.

27:25

Access before sending it to you and see the provider number, right under state, provider number, OK?

Nathan Baugh:

27:34

Click that, that will show you, is a rural health clinic, should I hit that one as well.

Sarah Potter:

No, do not click that. I will give you some inside scoop on that.

27:46

So, for me, you should see the provider number column on the bar, right, of your screen, and that Over your CCN.

27:58

Right, OK.

Nathan Baugh:

27:59

So, then, I want to see these are all FQHCs.

28:03

So, you should filter for rural health clinics.

28:10

OK, did I hit that you might need to type, type,

Sarah Potter:

type, rural, and see if we can sell to that way.

Nathan Baugh:

28:22

OK, there you go, wow, great. We got a one health care clinic if you're on, sorry.

28:29

But we got a number, OK. Great, so here it is!

28:35

Yes, this is cool. Good to know. All right. Well, yes.

28:38

Brand-new, brand new, OK.

28:41

So I will play around with this more and see what else, other cool things it can do, But yeah.

Sarah Potter:

28:50

And the rural health clinic column that you were going to click on, the show hide column only focuses on long term care centers.

29:03

So it's a little bit more narrow than the rural health clinic that you see in the in the column here.

Nathan Baugh:

29:13

So you're saying that there's long term health care centers that call themselves rural health clinics.

Sarah Potter:

29:19

So, if you click on is rural health clinic sites, this is a little bit beyond our, our data to station, but it is, if you click on the little information, I am the circle, it'll explain why it's a slightly different, um.

Nathan Baugh:

29:43

Yeah, yeah. It doesn't make.

29:46

We can, we'll sidebar this. Because I'm not take it back. Yeah, no, we have the question box open, and we want to keep data 2000.

29:56

I'm gonna put, I'm gonna make you the presenter again, OK, so we can get your contact info, and you can refer back to your slides as necessary.

So, we do have a question already from Jill Bryant, who asks, Where do we go to check the status of our application?

Can you see my screen?

Nathan Baugh:

Yes.

Sarah Potter:

30:29

OK, great to check the status of your application, there will be, let me see if I can get back to the screen here.

30:39

Um, when you click on Data 2000 Waiver Training Payment Program here, there will be multiple screens, one for you to submit your application, one for you to see the status of applications. So, you'll be able to see that it's been submitted, that it's under review, and that it's forwarded for payment processing.

31:02

So, you'll be able to see every, every sort of gatepost that it passes.

Nathan Baugh:

31:08

So, it's, it's in the AHP is under the organizations tab.

Sarah Potter:

31:14

That's right.

Nathan Baugh:

OK, great.

31:18

Alright.

31:18

We got an next question is from Rebecca McCain, who asks a provider's DEA number has an X, does that indicate that they have the waiver?

Sarah Potter:

31:30

Yes.

31:31

The X is the waver number, if it's an E, it's the exemption, and this is something that took a lot of folks have had tripped me up in the beginning. The data 2000 waver number is the number that SAMHSA issues to make sure that you can add prescribe medication assisted treatment. If there is an E and that waver number, it's because you've got the exemption from training, and you are not eligible for this program because you haven't been trained. I hope that makes sense.

Nathan Baugh:

32:07

So that makes sense.

Sarah Potter:

I mean, there's a nuance there.

Nathan Baugh:

32:11

And the exemption, that's the 30 patients, are the last thing, right?

Sarah Potter:

32:16

That's right, That's right, right.

Nathan Baugh:

32:18

So if you're doing a good volume, you really want to get the waiver, and you can get paid for it now to. Right next question is from Kelly Schultz.

32:28

She says, To clarify, if we have one provider that provides services under separate CCN's, they can only be claimed under one clinics, CCN not both.

Sarah Potter:

32:39

That's right.

Nathan Baugh:

32:41

Perfect. Thank you, Kelly. Our next question is from Bob Jones, who says, I have several certificates of completion from providers, but it does not list a training date.

32:51

Is the correctness of the training date versus the cert certificate date critical in the application?

32:59

Does that make sense?

Sarah Potter:

Yes. That's a great question.

33:02

So, in an ideal scenario, we would have the provider gives you that information so that you can complete the application, but it is not going to hold you up from submitting the application, or receiving payment if they're eligible.

Nathan Baugh:

33:23

Ok. So, so you guys verify the dates.

Sarah Potter:

33:27

We verify the the date of the waiver and waver number.

Nathan Baugh:

33:33

Yeah, OK.

33:35

So, would you say that it's fair to say, like if you think that you might qualify, go ahead and submit and then see if it does.

Sarah Potter:

33:44

yeah.

Nathan Baugh:

33:45

Yeah, OK, great, Next question is from, um, India Thomas', she's asked if we could show the helpful links page again.

33:57

And she asks will the slides be posted on the NARHC website.

And the answer is always, yes, we will get the slides and the recording posted on our website under the TA webinar tab, which is under our Resources page.

Yeah. If I could just make a pitch to the RHC community, as you guys know, this is first come first serve.

You know, they're going to have eventually this is going to run out.

And unlike the other things that have been going on recently, vacs confidantes, Grants.

35:00

Alright, so the test to get mitigation hundred thousand that you all received in June.

35:07

Everything else that's been going on, with regards to covid.

35:10

This is very, very straightforward, if you, if your clinicians are eligible, you get they get \$3000 or the clinic gets \$3000 to basically compensate them for that and that's it. You're done.

35:24

There's no, I mean, correct me if I'm wrong, there's no sort of follow up after you've gotten the money, right, Sarah?

35:32

Like you could, you could use it however you want after the after you get it.

Sarah Potter:

35:38

That's right.

35:39

You can use it however you want.

Nathan Baugh:

Right. So, it says that the strings are not attached to this money.

35:46

Like, they are attached to the grant dollars or the allocations we received from the Provider Relief Fund, so, vary.

35:55

Clear, cut, and simple, if you have eligible clinicians that got their waivers in 20 19 or after, this is a no-brainer, you get \$3000 per.

36:07

So, hopefully that encourages you to do it.

36:14

My pitching it, well, Sarah do you want to pitch that purpose.

Sarah Potter:

OK. absolutely. I appreciate that.

36:22

And I would echo and amplify your message, not to wait, this, we have received, a very positive response, because this program, and application, I can't even give my director at an actual figure, minute to minute. The number is changing.

36:44

So I would encourage folks to apply as soon as they have gathered their information, and to do it as, as soon as possible.

OK, well, we're going to go ahead, and we're going to keep, I see a question just came in.

We don't have to go the full length.

She says our providers attended the PCS S mat Waiver training, sponsored by the American Academy of Addiction, Psychiatric, Psychiatric Drug Treatment.

My gosh, that's uh, uh, mouthful, but their certificate does not have a two data, 2000 waiver number, They do have the X for the DEA number, and she wants to know is they qualified.

37:42

I don't know if this is makes sense to you.

Sarah Potter:

37:47

Sure.

37:49

Yes, in that situation, I might encourage them to I look at the lookup tool, and I put the link again on the screen, See if they can, you know, access a number.

OK, Yeah, because we will, the application does ask for both, and so I would encourage you to take advantage of this lookup tool.

Nathan Baugh:

OK. So, look up to see if your providers are already in the system as having a waiver.

Sarah Potter:

Right?

And with the lookup tool, it'll tell you, again, the date that the waiver was issued, the number of patients they can see, it's actually great source of information.
