



### How the 118th Congress Concluded

- The last short-term funding package was set to expire on December 20, and telehealth flexibilities were set to expire on December 31
- On December 17, Congress released 1,547 pages of legislative text which contained:
  - Short-term government funding through March 14
  - A fix to RHC telehealth policy in 2-year extension of Medicare telehealth policies
  - Pharmacy Benefit Manager (PBM) reform
  - Disaster funding
  - And more!



## How the 118th Congress Concluded

• On December 18, Elon Musk began to post on Twitter/X about the legislation:





### How the 118th Congress Concluded

- After 2 more iterations, on December 20, Congress passed a 116-page continuing resolution:
  - Funds the federal government through March 14
  - Extends Medicare telehealth flexibilities (including RHC G2025 policy) through March 31
  - 1 year farm bill
  - Disaster relief





#### Immediate Priorities of the 119th Congress

- Rapidly approaching a funding cliff of March 14 and important flexibilities/programs like Medicare medical telehealth expiring on March 31
- Senate also responsible for confirmation hearings of President-elect Trump's nominees
- Plans for budget reconciliation



### Telehealth Immediate Strategy

- NARHC is pushing for the next telehealth extension to contain a fix for RHC telehealth policy
  - The basis for this is the initial continuing resolution text which was based on the Telehealth Modernization Act
- We made significant strides in Members of Congress being aware of the need for this specific fix and the overall benefits/opportunities of telehealth
- Once telehealth bills are reintroduced this Congress, join us in advocating for a fix via Voter Voice

#### The Latest Regulatory Updates

- CMS published <u>CY 2025 payment rates</u> for care coordination and telehealth
- We are still awaiting guidance on vaccine billing / cost reporting beginning July 2025
- Status Update EKG Reimbursement Issue

#### HIPAA Security Rule - Proposed Rule

- First update since 2013, HHS/OCR deemed necessary given rapidly evolving technology and increases in cyberattacks
- Depending on your cybersecurity infrastructure currently, compliance with these provisions could be a significant lift
- Requirements would include:
  - Multi-factor authentication
  - Vulnerability scanning every 6 months; penetration testing every
    12 months
  - Network segmentation
  - Business associate agreements must be updated to contain security safeguards



#### HIPAA Security Rule - Proposed Rule

- Comments are due by March 7, 2025

- The entirety of this rule is to be determined as it was a Biden Administration Proposed Rule that would need to be finalized under the Trump Administration
  - While cybersecurity is a bipartisan priority, there is speculation that all rules in proposed status or recently implemented could be at risk of being completely eliminated or paused



#### **Upcoming Health Policy Expectations**

- In addition to the most immediate priorities (keeping the federal government open), the Republican majorities have big goals to cut spending, revisit past laws and regulations, etc.
- Last week, a "menu" of \$5 trillion+ in cuts that originated from House Republicans began floating around, containing:
  - "Repeal Major Biden Health Rules" -- \$420B savings
    - This could be nursing home staffing, Section 1557 Nondiscrimination, disability protections
  - "Reimagining the Affordable Care Act" -- \$151B savings
  - Medicaid "Per Capita Caps" -- \$918B savings
  - "SNAP Reforms" -- \$22B savings

 Additionally, while RFK Jr. still faces a Senate confirmation hearing, both the Senate and House have already developed "Make America Healthy Again" (MAHA) caucuses intended to

carry forward these ideas



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#### Senator Marshall Announces Make **America Healthy Again Caucus**

Washington, D.C. - Today, U.S. Senator Roger Marshall, M.D., a member of the Senate Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions (HELP) Committee, announced the creation of the Congressional Make America Healthy Again (MAHA) Caucus. This new caucus will focus on nutrition, access to affordable, high-quality-nutrient-dense foods, improving primary care. and addressing the root causes of chronic diseases.

Robert F. Kennedy Jr., President Trump's nominee for Department of Health & Human Services (HHS) Secretary, has endorsed the creation of this new caucus that will work to build a stronger and healthier America. Senator Marshall, a physician who practiced medicine for over 25 years, met with Mr. Kennedy earlier this week to discuss his nomination to lead HHS. Senator Marshall endorsed Mr. Kennedy's candidacy following

"The MAHA caucus is committed to improving health outcomes by prioritizing nutrition, providing access to affordable, nutrient-dense foods, and focusing on primary care availability to tackle the root causes of chronic diseases," Senator Marshall said. "With our 'Food is Medicine' approach, support from RFK Jr., and a shared goal to Make America Healthy Again, we aim to foster transparency, innovation, and a transformative agenda that builds a healthier, stronger nation."


- One of the best ways to help NARHC and the RHC program

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
